# Did You Know? 🤔

If your horse has a cough that persists into exercise or is heard while your equine friend is at rest in the barn, be sure to talk to your veterinarian about evaluating your horse for respiratory disease. It could be a problem with the upper airway (the nasal passages and throat) or the lower airway (the lungs).

While waiting for your appointment, try decreasing your horse's exposure to dust, as that is a primary trigger for lower respiratory disease such as asthma or heaves.

Some simple things you can do include avoiding straw bedding, not using a leaf blower on barn aisles, and not storing hay or bedding above your horse's stall. Last but not least, while we humans may be more comfortable with all the barn doors closed on colder days, your horses' lungs will appreciate open doors/windows and good ventilation! As always, if you have questions or would like to learn more about preserving your horse's respiratory health, your equine veterinarian remains your best source of information!

## THE COLD WEATHER IS UPON US! ❄️

Are you familiar with the many adaptations that help your horse stay warm during the cold winter months?

🌿 Hindgut digestion of hay produces the most heat, acting as a small furnace inside of the horse. This is why free choice; good quality hay is so important in the winter.

🐾 Horses have a huge muscle mass and muscle activity produces heat. This includes running and playing and even shivering if their body temperature starts to drop. It is important to remember that these activities also will result in a bigger caloric demand so free choice hay and in some cases, grain, is often needed.

👤 To blanket or not to blanket is a constant debate but either way, as it starts to get cold your horse will grow a thicker coat. If you decide to leave your horse unblanketed you may notice that they look "fluffy". This is due to a phenomenon called piloerection where the hair stands up to better trap air within. Two layers of the coat also help with warmth. The inner layer is softer and has air pockets to create an insulating layer. The outer layer is coarse and has oils that keep moisture from penetrating the insulating layer and keep the horse warm.

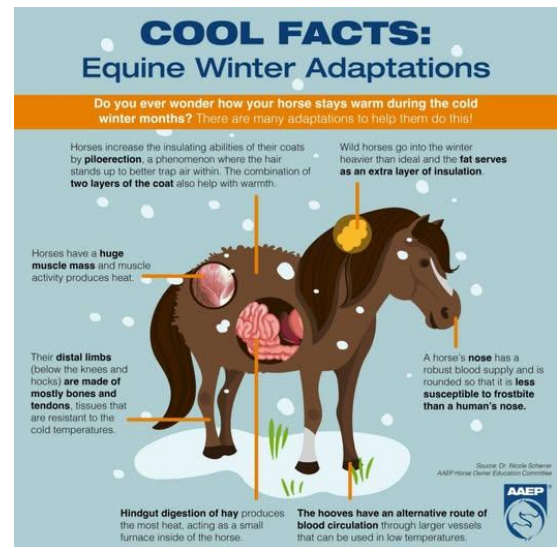
🐾 Wild horses go into the winter heavier than ideal, and the fat serves as an extra layer of insulation. However, if a horse is going to be kept heavily blanketed and in a barn during the cold weather months this is unnecessary and can lead to obesity related issues.

🐾 Their distal limbs (below the knees and hocks) are made of mostly bones and tendons, tissues that are resistant to the cold temperatures.

🐾 The hooves have an alternative route of blood circulation through larger vessels that can be used in low temperatures. This is why horses can stand in snow without detrimental effects.

🐾 A horse's nose has a robust blood supply and is rounded so that it is less susceptible to frostbite than a human's nose.

### Memberships

All riders and owners (including business entities) of horses showing in the PtHA Incentives Program must be PtHA members in good standing.

### Registration

Horses must be registered with PtHA in order to compete in the PtHA Incentives Program. The registration can be with either the Color Registry or the Solid Registry. Horses of both registries will compete together in the PtHA Incentives Program classes.

Horses may be enrolled under a "pending" PtHA registration, provided the registration is either accompanying the enrollment form or has already been received by the PtHA office. Any enrollment received without a registration may be subject to increased enrollment fees.

### Enrollment

Enrollment must be done using the PtHA Incentives Program Form. The form must be filled out completely and either emailed, faxed, or mailed into the PtHA office with payment. Enrollment makes the horse eligible to enter the respective PtHA Incentives Program classes. Additional fees apply to enter the PtHA Incentives Program classes with the classes to be held at the Color Breed Congress.

Enrollment fees are *per class*. For example, if you wish to enroll in Open Yearling Longe Line and Non-Pro Yearling Longe Line before May 31st, your total would be \$200.

You must mark each class you want to enroll in on the PtHA Incentives Program Form.

Horses must reenroll in the program each year.

100% of the enrollment fees will go towards the payout.

### Payment

Payment must be received in full at the time of enrollment. If an enrollment is received without payment, the enrollment will not be processed until payment is received. If payment is received at a later date, the enrollment may be subject to increased enrollment fees.

Enrollment payments are not refundable or transferable.

## Non-Pro Classes

PtHA Incentives Program classes marked as Non-Pro are for those exhibitors who hold either a PtHA Youth membership or a PtHA Amateur membership. Pintos owned or leased by the exhibitor or a member of his/her immediate family are eligible to be show in this division.

## Open Classes

PtHA Incentives Program classes marked as Open will be open to all exhibitors, including youth and amateur, provided they have a current PtHA membership.

## Payouts

100% of the horses' enrollment fees will be applied to the classes. 50% of \$100 class entry fee will be applied to the classes. \$500 of added money is included in the payout.

Payouts will be through 10<sup>th</sup> place.

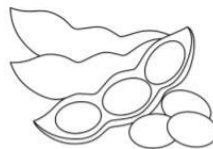
